In 2010 the mortgage crash forced Jason to relocate his family to Plano, TX. For the next few years he would find work in music very little except for the occisional church.

On a whim, Jason played his first open mic with Texas Music Network and that set the stage for his growth into the Texas Country Music industry. Jason began to open for headliners like Casper Mcwade and Kelly McGuire. Over the next few years he penned some great songs to be released but his demos are currently being spun by internet radio including "Midnight Rig to Memphis" and "Texas (is the state)".

In 2022 Jason won "Production of the Year" for Texas State Songwriters Championship. Jason spends his time between churches, benefits, private parties, local gigs, open mics, and supporting fellow local texas musicians.
